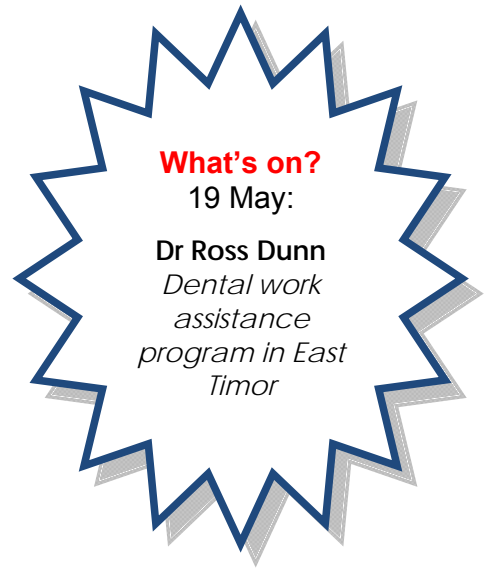

POLIO OUTBREAK

Since the Eradication Initiative's response to the initial outbreak in Syria, 22 Million Children have been vaccinated in the Middle East. However over 1 million children remain unvaccinated in Northern Pakistan which is now the engine room for the spread of Polio.

It is also concerning to note that over 70,000 AUSTRALIAN CHILDREN are not fully vaccinated against Polio and other vaccines that are available. IF YOU ARE TRAVELLING TO THE MIDDLE EAST OR ASIA PLEASE ENSURE YOUR BOOSTER VACCINATION SHOT HAD BEEN ADMINISTERED.
