Meeting Review

15th June 2009

More than half the population will be impacted by leukaemia, lymphoma or myeloma, either directly or indirectly, in their lifetimes.

In Queensland, about five people are diagnosed with leukaemia every day equating to about 1500 a year.

These were some of the statistics mentioned by this week's guest speaker Leukaemia Foundation of Queensland community relationships manager Hedley Lockyer.

Mr Lockyer said it could strike anybody, regardless of age, gender and circumstances. He said the only symptom may be awaking one day and feeling a bit unwell.

The foundation raises about \$10 million each year, of which \$1 million is spent on research, while the bulk of the remainder goes into providing counselling, financial assistance, accommodation and other support services to leukaemia victims and survivors.

Only about 20 per cent is spent on administration costs, which Mr Lockyer attributed mostly to the generosity of volunteers. The government doesn't contribute any money, with the main fundraising effort coming from the foundation's annual Shave For A Cure appeal held in March.

Mr Lockyer said the club could participate next year by sponsoring one of our members who agrees to participate.

Interestingly, the Leukaemia Foundation in Queensland was started by the Lions Club of Holland Park in 1975, which goes to show just how much a community service club can achieve.

Hedley said he was an accountant by trade from Sydney, who had spent 24 years working for Qantas, 12 years for the International Transport Association, seven years in the advertising industry and has been two-and-a-half years with the Leukaemia Foundation.

In other news, this week's meeting was attended by just 25 members, prompting club stalwart Wal Bishop to express his disappointment just before the meeting's close. He called on us to contact members who didn't attend and tell them what a wonderful meeting they missed.

On a good note, our female presence tripled with the inclusion of Rotarian Phil Little's daughter Selina and Assistant Governor Gordana Blazevic from Brisbane Sunrise, who along with Hedley, brought the overall meeting tally to 28.

Gordana thanked the club for its support during her term, particularly in regard to the sister club agreement with Kobe East, and promised she'd be back as a guest in the next financial year.

Meanwhile, Selina, a model and marketing student, is about to head to Tripoli in Libya with her partner for three months.

President-elect Mike Mauger called for people to put their name down on the member's speaker list. Only one has done this so far. To register, go to the Rotary Club of Brisbane and click on our club twice and drop down to the speaker list.

He also reminded us of the handover dinner which is July 3, 7 for 7.30pm at the Brisbane Club.

Chairwoman Alison Sandy then called for spots:

- PP Mel Evans reminded us of the Homeless National Soccer Championships in Brisbane on Sunday, July 19.
- Rotarian Phil Little talked about the imminent opening of the Innovation and Sustainability Centre at the Skill Tech TAFE at Acacia Ridge. His company, the Phil Little Sustainable Design Foundation, has a joint venture with the Queensland Government, but the building is still being fitted out. It's due to be completed in October.

Sergeant-at-Arms Tony Love fined everybody at the president's table because all the women were seated there and then proceeded to tell some jokes that only he could do justice! He again thanked Hedley for his talk and reiterated Alison's praise for Hedley's decision to come out of retirement to devote his passion and enthusiasm to such a worthy cause.
