Angela Murphy suggested that social media also be utilised for acknowledgements.


President Bruce reported that he was running short of photos showing club activities, and requested that members who had any good photos to please forward them to him.

GUEST SPEAKER

Jane Hillyard PHF provided members with an excellent presentation. Some of the slides from her presentation are contained here-in. Jane has championed the District 9620 Youth Programs; Rotary Youth Program of Enrichment (RYPEN), Rotary Youth Transition Seminar (RYTS), and Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA). Two camps for each program are run each year. Jane outlined the aims, activities, costs and target groups for each organisation. Focal areas for the programs are Resilience, Teamwork, and Self Esteem. A statistic was presented: there are a higher number of female participants in the Youth Programs. Jane answered a question by Angela Murphy by explaining that the programs are designed for young people who don't know their potential, as well as others that do know their potential.




